Program objectives	The course aims to provide training of high qualification in legal science applied to the study of the regulation of the economy. The goal is to provide a wealth of knowledge that combines the technical expertise of its legal disciplines with a comparison between systems and legal institutions. The main focus is on the aspects of public and private law of the functioning of markets and the phenomenon of internationalization and Europeanization of law. Research topics will be identified in order to allow the study of legal institutions that govern the economy in the perspective of both a possible continuation of the research in the academia and the acquisition of the legal tools that the legal practice in the XXI century requires.
