Program goals	<p>The course aims to provide a highly qualified training in legal science, applied to the study of economy regulation. Thus, the course is devoted to the study of the phenomena related to markets law, in particular to those linked to the internationalisation and Europeanisation of law, as well as to the European and global crises (economic, migratory and security), upon which the 2017 DISTU project, which was awarded the "Excellence" by the Italian Ministry of Education (MIUR), is build. By framing law as a complex social phenomenon, the course aims to provide PhD candidates with the ability to handle advanced research tools and develop core critical thinking skills. Successful candidates who will receive the grant will be also required – as a fundamental part of their learning experience – to spend seven months abroad, within the framework of several research stay at research institutions and universities. For successful candidates who will not receive the grant the mandatory period abroad is reduced to three months (they will receive a reimbursement of the cost afforded). The research topics will be identified, taking also into account the research project presented, in order to allow an in-depth analysis of the legal concepts and issues above-mentioned. As to the methodology, particular attention will be committed to cross-cutting issues allowing an open cultural dialogue and the cross-fertilisation of knowledge, which is topical for the lawyers of the 21st century.</p>
