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INTRODUCTION – THE ERASMUS PROGRAMME 2021-2027

Study mobility for the academic year **2026/2027** is governed by the regulations relating to the new seven-year cycle of the **Erasmus+ Programme (2021-2027)**.

Art. 1 – GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Objectives

The **Erasmus+ Student Mobility for Study Programme** allows students to spend a continuous period of study at a **European university** that has an exchange agreement with the **University of Tuscia**.

Students participating in the mobility programme receive a **financial contribution**, have the opportunity to attend courses and make use of the facilities available at the host institution **without paying additional tuition fees** (except for small contributions that are also charged to local students), with the guarantee of **full recognition of the educational activities successfully completed abroad**, provided that they have been approved in the **Learning Agreement**.

The Erasmus+ Programme enables students to experience cultural activities abroad, become familiar with new higher education systems, and meet young people from other countries, thereby actively participating in the process of **European integration**.

At the end of the mobility period, the recognition of positive results achieved at partner institutions takes place through the adoption of the **ECTS (European Credit Transfer System)**, applied both to grades and to credits earned. Please note that at the **University of Tuscia, 1 CFU (University Educational Credit) corresponds to 1 ECTS credit**.

1.2 Countries Participating in the Erasmus+ Programme

It is possible to carry out a study mobility period at a partner university located in one of the following countries participating in the Erasmus+ Programme:

- **Member States of the European Union:** Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Cyprus, Croatia, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, and Hungary;
- **European Economic Area countries:** Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway;
- **Candidate countries for EU accession:** Turkey, North Macedonia.

1.3 Mobility to the Country of Origin

Students who are **citizens of one of the countries participating in Erasmus+** and enrolled at the **University of Tuscia** are eligible for mobility at a university in their **country of origin**, provided that they are **not yet resident in that country**; however, they will **not be given priority** during the selection process.

In addition, before confirming acceptance of the exchange place, they must obtain **authorization (approval)** from the host university.

1.4 Types of Mobility

Mobility may be of two types: **long-term mobility (LONG MOBILITY)** and **short-term mobility (SHORT MOBILITY)**.

1) LONG MOBILITY

This type of mobility is intended for students enrolled in **first-, second-, and third-cycle degree programmes** at the **University of Tuscia**. It will take place at **partner universities**, in accordance with the signed agreements.

Each long mobility period must have a **mandatory minimum duration of 2 months (60 days)** and a **maximum duration of 5 months (150 days)** and must, in any case, take place **between 1 June 2026 and 31 July 2027**. The mobility period must be **continuous**.

The duration of the stay abroad is established by the agreements signed with the host university.

2) SHORT MOBILITY

According to the Erasmus Programme 2021–2027, only PhD students and students enrolled in first-, second- and third-cycle degree programmes who participate in **Blended Intensive Programmes (BIP)** to which the University of Tuscia is a partner may carry out a short mobility. Short mobility must have a **mandatory minimum duration of 5 days** and a **maximum of 30 days**, must be **continuous**, and must in any case take place **between 1 June 2026 and 31 July 2027**.

1.5 Financial contribution for long- and short-term mobility

The financial contribution provided for students in Erasmus+ study mobility contributes to covering the costs of staying abroad.

The funding consists of:

- **European Union contribution for long-term mobility.**

The amount is monthly and proportional to the actual stay abroad; it is distinguished by groups of destination countries (as defined by the European Commission) according to cost of living, as shown in the table below:

- **Supplementary grant for candidates with fewer opportunities for long-term mobility.**

Students with fewer opportunities are participants who meet one or more of the following conditions:

- disadvantaged socio-economic conditions;
- needs related to physical, mental or health conditions.

Eligible candidates receive an additional **€250.00 per month**, on top of the individual Erasmus+ grant for study mobility, as shown in the table below:

To identify students entitled to the supplementary individual grant, the ISEE and/or ISEEUP uploaded to the GOMP portal by the call deadline (20 March 2026) and referring to enrolment in the academic year 2025/2026 will be taken into account.

If these data are not available by the call deadline, the additional grant cannot be awarded.

- **For candidates with needs related to physical, mental or health conditions**, a special funding is available from the European Union based on the actual costs incurred. For more information, contact the Office of Mobility and International Cooperation.

- **European Union contribution for short-term mobility.**

The scholarship for short-term mobility is calculated as follows:

- **Candidates with fewer opportunities in short-term physical mobility** receive a one-off supplement in addition to the individual Erasmus+ grant, as indicated below:

- **Supplementary contribution from the University of Tuscia.**

This amount was approved by the Board of Directors on 15 July 2025 based on available budget funds.

It will be paid to regularly enrolled students who:

- present disadvantaged economic conditions;

- are on Erasmus Study long-term mobility (at least 2 months);
- obtain at least **12 CFU** during the normal duration of their course and during the mobility period.

The contribution will be tiered according to three income brackets (ISEE and/or ISEEUP) as follows:

Students and recent graduates with disadvantaged socio-economic conditions are identified by Ministerial Decree 180/2025, which for the academic year 2025/2026 links economic disadvantage to an Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator (ISEE and/or ISEEUP) less than or equal to **€ 27,948.60**.

For identification of students entitled to the supplementary individual grant, the ISEE and/or ISEEUP presented at enrolment/registration for the academic year 2025/2026 will be taken into account.

IMPORTANT:

All students and/or PhD candidates, specialization trainees who are exempt from submitting the ISEE and/or ISEEUP for tuition purposes must nevertheless request and upload the ISEE and/or ISEEUP for university study rights 2025 on the GOMP portal by the call deadline in order to benefit from the M.U.R. supplementary contribution.

University supplementary contributions will not be paid to students who are enrolled beyond the first "fuori corso" year (the calculation refers to the year of matriculation at the University of Tuscia, even in case of course transfer).

Students who do not manage to obtain recognition of at least **12 CFU** in their academic record by **31/07/2027** will be required to reimburse the specific M.U.R. contribution already paid and any supplementary amounts will be cancelled.

Recognition in the academic record must be completed exclusively via the digital procedures through the personal page in the GOMP system. The above limits do not apply to PhD students and specialization trainees.

1.6 Tax treatment of the Erasmus+ grant

Pursuant to Art. 1, paragraph 50, of Law no. 208 of 28 December 2015, scholarships for international mobility are subject to the exemptions provided for in article 1, paragraph 3, of Decree-Law no. 105 of 9 May 2003, converted with amendments by Law no. 170 of 11 July 2003, subject to any further regulatory changes.

1.7 Travel grant

A travel support is provided based on specified distance brackets and on whether the trip was undertaken in a green / non-green mode. A **green trip** means travel mainly by bus and/or train for the majority of the outbound and return distance. Beneficiaries of an Erasmus+ study mobility under this Call will be required to keep travel documents, which must be submitted to the Mobility Office at the end of the mobility period. The amounts provided (National Provisions attached to the Programme Guide 2025) are:

The travel distance between the city of Viterbo and the destination city will be determined exclusively using the EU distance calculator available at: https://ec.europa.eu/programmes/erasmus-plus/resources/distance-calculator_en.

1.8 Payment of the grant

The Erasmus+ grant (European Union contribution and University of Tuscia supplementary contribution) will be paid in **two instalments**, subject to accreditation of the funds by the National Erasmus+ Agency (INDIRE) and to the allocation in the University budget of co-financing amounts.

The payment methods and the minimum clauses defined by the European Commission to obtain the grant are specified in the Erasmus+ Mobility Financial Agreement that each student signs with the University of Tuscia. For departures in the **first semester**, the final deadline is **31 August 2026**, while for departures in the **second semester** the final deadline is **31 December 2026**.

Payments will be made exclusively by crediting an Italian bank or postal account (or a prepaid card with an IBAN) in the name of the student beneficiary.

The Erasmus+ grant (EU contribution and any University of Tuscia supplementary contribution) will be paid in two instalments:

- **Advance:** 80% of the total grant amount based on the period of stay, to be paid within **30 days** of signing the aforementioned agreement. However, it is necessary to send a document with the arrival date at the host institution to confirm the start of mobility.
- **Balance:** the remaining 20% of the grant, together with the Travel Contribution, is paid after the Mobility Office has received the final certificate of stay issued by the host university, the transcript of exams and ECTS credits acquired (Transcript of Records), and travel documents (air tickets and boarding passes) with the actual dates of mobility.

The grant balance is also conditional on the online submission of the **Beneficiary Report** automatically sent by the Beneficiary Module, the European system for managing mobility projects.

In the absence of the Beneficiary Report, the Participant must return the entire grant.

The Transcript of Records must be submitted even in case of failed exams.

Article 2 – REQUIREMENTS AND METHODS OF SUBMITTING THE APPLICATION

2.1 Eligibility requirements for the selection

The following students are eligible to apply for the allocation of **n. 112 Erasmus Study mobility grants of 5 months**: students who, at the time of application, are enrolled in degree programmes / master's degree / PhD programmes at the University of Tuscia for the academic year **2025/2026**, regardless of

nationality (see art. 1.3), and who meet all the credit and grade average requirements set out in **Annex 1** of this Call “Evaluation Criteria”.

Students must have language skills equivalent to at least **level B1** in the language(s) of the destination country or in a language accepted by the host institution as the medium of instruction, as provided in art. 2.3.

Students currently enrolled in a bachelor’s degree programme who intend to graduate before departure and who apply to spend part of the first year of their master’s degree abroad must be enrolled in a master’s degree course at the University of Tuscia at the time of departure; otherwise they will forfeit the scholarship and the right to leave. These students must prepare the Learning Agreement for the study activities to be carried out as part of the master’s degree programme they will enroll in.

PhD students may participate subject to authorization from the programme/school coordinator/director. PhD students who receive a doctoral scholarship may use the additional funding provided for stays abroad, which will be added to the Erasmus+ funding from the European Commission. Pursuant to the rules on prohibition of double funding and provisions relating to compatibility with the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (PNRR), doctoral scholarships financed by PNRR funds do **not** allow receipt of multiple concurrent EU funds for the same type of action.

Absence of any of the above requirements will result in exclusion from the selection. Candidates are admitted to the selection conditionally pending verification of the required qualifications. The University of Tuscia may at any time, with reasoned motivation, exclude a candidate for lacking the admission requirements set out in this Call.

ATTENTION: IF ADDITIONAL FUNDS BECOME AVAILABLE, THE RANKING LIST WILL BE EXTENDED BEYOND POSITION NO. 112.

2.2 Incompatibilities

Students applying to the Erasmus+ Student Mobility for Study Call:

- may receive one Erasmus grant for each study cycle (bachelor’s, master’s and doctoral) for a **total period not exceeding 12 months per cycle**; for single-cycle degrees the maximum number of months is **24**. Candidates who have already carried out mobility under the Lifelong Learning Programme 2007–2013 (Erasmus Study, Placement, or Leonardo da Vinci), Erasmus+ 2014–2020 (Study, Traineeship or International Credit Mobility) or Erasmus Mundus, or who have already been selected for a Traineeship mobility or for International Credit Mobility to non-European countries, and who apply for the same study cycle in this Call, are eligible provided that the **sum of months** of previous mobility and the mobility for which they are applying **does not exceed 12 months**. Post-degree traineeship months are counted within the cycle in which the candidate was enrolled at the time of application.
- cannot receive other EU-funded grants for stays abroad (including grants for Joint Master Degrees – formerly Erasmus Mundus Action 1) that overlap, even partially, with the Erasmus+ traineeship period (to be declared on acceptance of the scholarship);
- incoming international students benefitting from Erasmus Mundus Action 2 scholarships enrolled in master’s degree programmes cannot simultaneously receive Erasmus Mundus Action 3 scholarships and the Erasmus contribution. For EMA2 projects that allow it, students may suspend the relevant scholarship if they win the Erasmus grant, after having previously and mandatorily informed and obtained approval from the project coordinator.

2.3 Language competence

Language skills must be declared with **Annex 2 – Self-Certification**, available on the University website at: <https://www.unitus.it/internazionale/studiare-all-estero/erasmus/>

At the time of application it is preferable that candidates already have the language skills required by each host institution (the required level can be verified in the list of destinations), either in the language(s) of the destination country or in a language accepted by the host as a “medium of instruction”.

If the student holds an international language certificate according to the Common European Framework, they may upload it to the portal as an attachment to their application.

Students unable to demonstrate adequate foreign language knowledge by one of the methods above must take an assessment test at the University Language Centre (CLA) to identify their level; the test schedule will be communicated by the Mobility Office. Students who do not achieve the required level at the assessment will be required to attend a **compulsory preparatory course** before departure (the course is offered free of charge by the University through the CLA).

Students who demonstrate the required level in the test may attend the preparatory course optionally, although it is strongly recommended.

Students declaring in Annex 2 that they have no knowledge of the destination country's language are exempt from the assessment test but must attend the compulsory preparatory course before departure.

2.4 OLS – Online Linguistic Support (OLS)

Language learning is one of the Erasmus+ objectives to protect linguistic diversity and develop intercultural skills. The programme offers students the opportunity to improve language skills before and during mobility via free online courses through the EU Academy platform at: <https://academy.europa.eu/local/euacademy/pages/course/community-overview.php?title=learn-a-new-language>

Selected students and recent graduates for mobility to a Programme country or a non-associated third country (KA131 and KA171 actions) who undertake mobility longer than **14 days** must take the initial linguistic assessment test in the language of mobility before the start of mobility, except in duly justified cases (e.g., language not available in OLS). With the new OLS, students and recent graduates can choose one or more languages without limitation on the number of courses and can test their language level during or after mobility. Currently available languages are: **Italian, English, Spanish, German, French** from **A1 to B2**. The service will gradually include 29 languages at all learning levels.

2.5 Choice of destinations – consult the list of available offers

Students may choose destinations among universities with which the University of Tuscany has bilateral Erasmus agreements, selecting the ISCED subject code available for their course of study.

ATTENTION: The following destinations, involving universities partnered with the University of Tuscany under specific Double Degree agreements, will be **prioritised** for students enrolled in the

corresponding degree/master's programmes who meet the specific requirements provided in the various agreements and to be verified with the academic coordinator of the agreement:

The Mobility Office will ensure these destinations are correctly assigned and may intervene in the automatic assignment of destinations if necessary.

2.6 Choice of destinations – check for exclusionary requirements

Once destinations of interest have been identified, students must check the partner institutions' websites for conditions that could prevent departure, such as close or expired application deadlines, high language requirements, or incompatibility of the study offer.

Partner universities may refuse students even if they have been selected by the University of Tuscia.

2.7 Activities to be carried out at the host institution and Learning Agreement

Activities permitted during the mobility period, to be included in the Learning Agreement prepared before departure, are:

- coursework (teaching activities) and related assessment (exams);
- preparation of a bachelor's/master's/PhD thesis;
- traineeship (only if provided for by the study regulations).

Similarly, PhD students must agree the training programme abroad with the PhD coordinator.

For all academic aspects of mobility, students must refer to the Erasmus+ Departmental Coordinators (see Annex 3, available at: <https://www.unitus.it/internazionale/studiare-all-estero/erasmus/>).

ATTENTION: During mobility, Erasmus students may not sit exams nor obtain the final degree at the University of Tuscia.

2.8 Recognition

The period of study abroad is an integral part of the University of Tuscia's study programme and must receive full academic recognition: the University of Tuscia must recognise the period spent abroad (without additional programme integrative work or extra exams) as corresponding to and substituting an equivalent period of study at the University, even if course contents do not match exactly.

In evaluating the studies completed, consideration is given to the value and weight of all teaching activities typical of the host university during the study period.

At the end of mobility, recognition of positive results obtained at partner institutions is carried out using the **ECTS credit transfer system**, applied to both grades and credits earned.

Remember that at the University of Tuscia **1 CFU = 1 ECTS**.

Students cannot have credits recognised for courses with content corresponding to those already taken at the University of Tuscia.

At the end of Erasmus mobility, the host institution must provide the Mobility Office of this University with:

- a **Transcript of Records** related to the study programme carried out in accordance with the Learning Agreement;
- a certificate certifying the dates of the mobility period.

The University of Tuscia rewards students who participated in Erasmus Mobility by **increasing their graduation score by 1 point**.

2.9 Submission of application

Interested students must complete the application using the Gomp student portal at:

After logging in, the study-call form is reachable via: Home > Career, Study Plan, Exams > International Mobility > Study.

When completing the application it will be necessary to indicate the number of months already spent abroad in Erasmus mobility (see art. 2.2).

Periods of Erasmus mobility carried out virtually from the usual country of residence from academic year **2020/2021** onward WILL NOT be counted for the calculation of maximum Erasmus mobility months per study cycle.

When filling in the application, the candidate may select all available institutions for the ISCED codes linked to their course of study and rank them in order of preference.

Students enrolled in a PhD course whose administrative headquarters are the University of Tuscia can apply only to destinations where the wording "dottorando" (PhD student) appears.

The deadline is **11:59 p.m. on 20 March 2026**.

Please note:

- each candidate may submit **ONLY ONE** application;
- students enrolled in Master's programmes, Schools of Specialization, or single courses **cannot** participate in the selection;
- no paper documentation is required.

Article 3 – SELECTION PROCEDURES

3.1 Evaluation, ranking lists and distribution of mobility places among Departments

The **n. 112** total places for Erasmus+ Study mobility for the academic year 2026/2027 are allocated among the Departments of the University of Tuscia according to the following criteria:

- a) each Department is reserved a **minimum contingent of n. 10 places**;
- b) remaining places, once the minimum quota for each Department has been guaranteed, are assigned based on merit ranking lists drawn up within the individual teaching units, respecting candidates' expressed priorities and availability at partner institutions.

If one or more Departments do not fully use their reserved quota, unassigned places will be redistributed among other Departments based on the general University ranking, according to merit criteria and compatibility with available destinations.

Places are assigned following a selection based on the Evaluation Criteria in **Annex 1**. In case of a tie score, the following priority criteria apply, in order:

- priority to the candidate who **has not already benefited** from an Erasmus+ mobility, with or without a grant;
- secondarily, priority to the **younger** candidate, pursuant to Law 16/06/1998 n. 191, art. 2.

Each candidate can check the assigned host institution via the GOMP portal. If the assigned institution meets their mobility needs, the candidate must accept it **within 5 days** of publication or notification of the outcome, following the procedures indicated on the portal.

Alternatively, the candidate may refuse the assigned institution and compete for the ranking related to an alternative institution, according to subsequent allocations made by moving down the ranking. By accessing the portal again, candidates can check any new assigned destination and accept it within the stated deadlines.

Failure to accept within the established deadlines equals renunciation of the mobility for the assigned institution and allows other candidates in the ranking to take the place.

Refusal of the exchange place does not result in any academic penalty nor affect participation in subsequent international mobility calls.

The University reserves the right to proceed with further ranking list movements in relation to renunciations or availability of additional funds.

Article 4 – DEADLINES AND PROCEDURES FOR SELECTED STUDENTS

By **20 April 2026** students must complete their Learning Agreement with the support of the Department Erasmus+ Coordinator.

Departures usually occur:

- **for the 1st semester:** in September/October 2026;

- **for the 2nd semester:** in January/February 2027.

After confirming acceptance of the assigned institution, selected students must:

- visit the host university's website to find detailed information on the study offer and download required documentation;
- submit to the Department Erasmus+ Coordinators (see Annex 3) a draft Learning Agreement based on the host university's study offer, which also determines whether the stay corresponds to the 1st or 2nd semester;
- sign the Mobility Agreement within the established deadlines.

By accepting the host, the University of Tuscia will communicate with partner universities.

NB: INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS ARE INFORMED THAT THE RESIDENCE PERMIT MUST BE RENEWED AND VALID TO COVER THE MOBILITY, AND IN ANY CASE MUST BE VALID **NO LATER THAN 30 SEPTEMBER 2026. A COPY OF THE VALID RESIDENCE PERMIT MUST BE SENT TO THE MOBILITY OFFICE BY THE INDICATED DEADLINE. IF REQUESTED DOCUMENTATION IS NOT PROVIDED, THE OFFICE WILL AUTOMATICALLY PROCEED WITH RANKING LIST MOVEMENTS.**

Article 5 – INSURANCE COVERAGE

Health

Each beneficiary must personally ensure health coverage: if the candidate holds the **European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)** they are entitled to National Health Service benefits in all EU countries (for information see: <http://ec.europa.eu/social/main.jsp?catId=559&langId=it> ; www.sistemats.it). However, EHIC coverage or private insurance may be insufficient, especially in cases of repatriation or specific medical intervention. In such cases, additional private insurance may be useful.

Civil liability and accident
