### At the University of Tuscia an international seminar on Double and Joint Degrees and transnational academic cooperation

Viterbo, 21–22 April 2026 – The University of Tuscia will host the international seminar "**Double and Joint Degrees and Other Forms of Transnational Cooperation in Teaching**", organized as part of the TNE IMPACT – **Innovative Mediterranean Partnership for Advancing Collaborative Teaching** project, coordinated by UNITUS.

The initiative will be held over two days:

- **21 April 2026 (3:30 pm - 5:30 pm, CET)** in hybrid mode, at the **Sala Spinelli** of the University of Tuscia (Via S. Maria in Gradi, 4 - Viterbo) and online
- **22 April 2026 (9:30 - 11:30, CET)** in entirely online mode

The seminar will open with institutional greetings from the Rector of the **University of Tuscia, Tiziana Laureti**, and the Pro-Rector of the **Roma Tre University, Giorgio Resta**, testifying to the strong inter-university collaboration and shared commitment to the internationalization of teaching as part of the TNE IMPACT project, aimed at strengthening academic cooperation in the Mediterranean area.

The main speaker will be **Prof. Maurizio Tira**, former Rector of the University of Brescia and authoritative expert in territorial planning and policies for universities and international cooperation, who will lead the work by addressing the main issues related to the development of joint programs and international academic cooperation.

The seminar represents an important opportunity for discussion on:

- the development of **Double and Joint Degrees**
- the **European Degree Label** and the future joint European degree
- university governance **models** and internationalization strategies
- opportunities for cooperation with **non-EU countries**

The event is part of the activities promoted by the TNE IMPACT project, aimed at strengthening academic partnerships in the Mediterranean area and promoting innovative models of collaborative teaching at an international level.

*"Internationalization represents a strategic lever for the growth of the university system and for the construction of increasingly integrated and competitive training courses at a global level,"* emphasizes Prof Simone Severini, coordinator of the project at the University of Tuscia.
